



University of New Mexico Rural Student Project

THE PROGRAM

The Rural Student Project (RSP) was established to identify, recruit, and support students from rural New Mexico communities at the University of New Mexico. RSP will provide a financial stipend for rural students during one academic year to assist them in achieving their educational goals while also helping them create roots in the Albuquerque and UNM community. As an RSP scholar, you will have the opportunity, along with other scholars, to volunteer in Albuquerque, gain experience outside the academic realm, meet community members, and make an impact in your new hometown.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible students must have graduated from a rural high school or must have resided in a rural community in New Mexico. The Rural Student Project is looking for students whose hometown population is lower than 50,000 people or students who come from a subdivision community of an urban area with a population no larger than 2,500 people. If you have any question on this please contact us.

Student must have filed a FASFA form (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and demonstrate a financial need. Additionally, the applicant must be admitted and enrolled full-time (min. 15 credit hours) at the University of New Mexico.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Scholars agree to participate in the Rural Student Project for one academic year (Fall and Spring semesters). During this year scholars will attend one orientation, two workshops, and perform <u>30 hours of community service per semester</u> with a Rural Student Project partner, La Plazita Institute. La Plazita engages New Mexico's youth, elders and communities in a comprehensive and culturally responsive approach based on the philosophy of *La Cultura Cura* or culture heals.
